



Kumamoto, Famed for Its Castle and Caldera Web Japan Take a Journey Through 400 Years of History





Kumamoto Prefecture, located on the southernmost of Japan's four main islands, Kyushu, boasts verdant natural surroundings and a rich historical heritage. Kumamoto Castle, one of the three most celebrated fortresses in the country, stands as a symbol of the prefecture. The castle was restored to mark its 400th anniversary in 2007. Buildings lost to warfare and the ravages of time were rebuilt using traditional construction methods; now, visitors from both Japan and overseas come to appreciate its awesome beauty. In 2008 it drew more than 2 million visitors, making it the most-visited castle in Japan for the first time in its history. Kumamoto's other attractions include the famous Kurokawa Onsen hot spring resort and Mount Aso, an active volcano

with one of the largest calderas, or volcanic basins, in the world.
